**EVENTS** Three-Position Air Rifle Competition. The event will be a 3 x 20 (20

prone, 20 standing and 20 kneeling) without a final for both precision and sporter. Each competitor will fire the course once. The event is for individuals and teams. This event will be held concurrently with a Preliminary Tryout (PTO) and the Colorado Progressive Position Pistol

(PPP) State Championships – please contact Jim Shaver at <a href="mailto:shajecolo@yahoo.com">shajecolo@yahoo.com</a> for information on those events.

This match will qualify teams and at-large individuals to represent the state of Colorado in the Three-Position Air Rifle National Championships to be held at Camp Perry, OH, in early July. Travel subsidies from USA Shooting

for the state qualifiers are likely, but not guaranteed.

**TIME SCHEDULE** Saturday, May 9, 2009:

7:00 AM Registration and equipment checks

8:30 AM: Relay 1 – Downstairs Range 11:00 AM: Relay 2 – Downstairs Range

1:30 PM: Relay 3 (only if all previous relays are filled)

Reminder: Official preparation time starts 10 minutes prior to each relay.

An award ceremony will be held as quickly as practical after the final relay.

EQUIPMENT CLASSES This match will have both Sporter and Precision classes.

COMPETITION OPEN TO

Any student (no minimum age) currently enrolled in elementary, middle, high school or equivalent educational program such as home schooling (or just graduated). Teams must maintain team integrity (see Rule 3.2). Teams must be made up of individuals from the same school or club. Coaches may be required to certify that all shooters attend the same school or club.

Competitors do not need to be members of USA Shooting or the NRA.

**RULES** 

*National Standard Three-Position Air Rifle Rules 2008-2010 Edition*, with applicable changes, will apply.

**AWARDS** 

**Individual:** Medals will be provided for each class of competitor. Second place awards will be provided for any class which contains four or more competitors. Third place awards will be provided for any class which contains six or more competitors.

**Team:** An award will be presented to each first place team in each class, provided there are at least two teams in the class. Second place awards will be provided for any class which contains four or more teams. Third place awards will be provided for any class which contains six or more teams.

**RANGE** 

Olympic Shooting Center (Building 3), United States National Training Center, One Olympic Plaza, Colorado Springs, CO 80909. The complex is located at the northwest corner of Boulder and Union, in Colorado Springs.

**ENTRY FEES** 

All fees are to be paid during registration on the day of the match. Checks should be made out to "NTCSC Juniors".

The entry fee is \$15 per individual competitor. The team entry fee is \$12.00 per team.

**ACCOMODATIONS** 

There are a number of hotels, motels, and restaurants within reasonably close proximity to the National Training Center.

**OTHER** 

This match is open to both individuals and teams. Although team participation in highly encouraged, **competitors who are not on a team are warmly welcome and can compete for the at-large selections** to the National Championships.

The match will be shot on stationary target frames. AR 5/10 targets will be used. It will, therefore, be necessary to use a binocular or telescope to check shots during each stage.

Competitors should also bring a clock, timer, or stopwatch to aid in

managing their time.

There will not be a Final.

Clear Barrel Indicators (CBI) will be mandatory. Materials will be available to construct them.

Each team must have at least one designated coach who is responsible for the team.

Competitors under the age of eighteen must be accompanied by a parent or coach.
